<p>Currently, when pulp_installer is run against a RedHat family distro, it will always set it to enabled, permissive and targeting. This has been casually referred to as "disabled".</p> <p>Because we are implementing support for SELinux policies in the installer, we should no longer do this.</p> <p>Even if we do implement some sort of auto-detection logic for disabling it in the future, a removal notice should be provided in the changelog, so I created this ticket.</p>
